The BH clinician will work in a fast-paced healthcare environment, with frequent interactions with patients and healthcare professionals. The BH Clinician will provide both tele-health or in-person services.</p>

Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Conduct mental health assessments and develop treatment plans for patients with a range of mental health concerns, including anxiety, depression, trauma, and substance abuse. • Provide individual therapy services to patients using evidence-based approaches, such as cognitive-behavioral therapy, trauma-focused therapy, and motivational interviewing. • Consult on the development of outpatient groups (ex. Intensive Outpatient/Anger Management/ Relapse Prevention) • Collaborate with healthcare professionals within IHC, including the behavioral health care manager, primary care providers, collaborating psychiatrist, nurses, community health workers, and office staff to provide coordinated care for patients. • Maintain accurate and timely documentation of patient care in EPIC in accordance with IHC and regulatory guidelines. • Participate in team meetings and quality improvement activities to ensure high-quality and effective care for patients. • Stay up to date with best practices in mental health treatment and participate in continuing education activities to maintain licensure and professional development.
